About the Venue: Designed by architects Daniel H. Burnham and Pierce Anderson, Washington Union Station is a restored, historic, mixed-use, intermodal transportation hub located in the heart of DC. Originally opened in 1908, Union Station served as the primary rail transit hub in the city for most of the 20th century until 1981 when, following structural decline of the building, the National Park Service closed its doors to the public. In 1981, the Union Station Redevelopment Act provided funding to restore the building and in 1988 it reopened with expanded retail and food services. In 2015, the Union Station Redevelopment Corporation released a Historic Preservation Plan to guide preservation and restoration at the station complex well into the 21st century.
